PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Dear St. Ignatius Catholic School Community,

The last few weeks I have had many opportunities to spend time with educators and leaders from around the country. It is no surprise that highly individualized learning is sought after by educators everywhere and is not a priority that is exclusive to St. Ignatius. However, St. Ignatius is unique in that we have a profound opportunity to establish a set of instructional methods that enable this high individualization from the very start. Our academic design and strategies are concrete and tangible steps towards achieving a personalized education for each of our students.

As parents, we daily recognize the uniqueness of our children. Though we are all made in the image and likeness of God, we animate that image with our personalities and passions, our backgrounds and our interests, our strengths and our weaknesses. We already know that the first students of St. Ignatius Catholic School will bring an array of diverse vibrancy to our school. Ranging from age three to age fourteen, our students are coming from 59 different schools both in and out of the Treasure Valley. 33% of our students are coming from Catholic schools, 29% from West Ada School District, 19% from other surrounding districts, and 19% from local private schools. Some of our students are moving to Idaho from other states, and some have been homeschooled. While many of our students come from Holy Apostles parish, we also have students of different faith backgrounds. We are a colorful mix of backgrounds, ages, personalities, and interests.

To celebrate our individuality, we are hosting a special event for our first students. On April 22nd every enrolled student at St. Ignatius will have a unique opportunity to physically leave a lasting mark at our new school. Every student is invited to come to the parish Dining Hall to create a small mosaic that will later be incorporated into a larger art piece that will become a permanent part of St. Ignatius. The mosaics will represent our first students, and the many differences we have that together make our whole student body a true work of art. Please don't miss this event!

The uniqueness of every student truly makes our community a colorful mosaic that our faculty and staff will encounter daily. And while we are all one-of-a-kind, every child will pass through the doors of the school building on August 22nd united as a member of the St. Ignatius Catholic School family.

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INNOVATIONS IN LEARNING- INQUIRY BASED LEARNING

Inquiry-based learning is an instructional philosophy that employs certain teaching methods, lesson planning, and curricular techniques that will bring student curiosity and agency to the forefront of learning. In an inquiry-based classroom, teachers' primary activity is facilitating learning, rather than delivering content or prescriptively delineating skills. Elements of inquiry-based learning will infuse all subjects at St. Ignatius, but it will be the primary organizing principle in science, and will help bring to life the STEAM emphasis in the school's academic approach.

St. Ignatius' goals in adopting an inquiry-based approach are to:


- Engage students in their learning process, and center each individual student in his or her own learning;
- Develop cross-disciplinary critical thinking skills, which students will be able to apply independently and in groups; and
- Provide extensive opportunities for collaboration and teamwork among students.

Science instruction at St. Ignatius will follow several trimester-long inquiry-based learning arcs. These inquiry-based learning arcs will be driven by student questions about the world around them and will facilitate extensive, collaborative work.

In an inquiry-based project, students follow a four step cycle:

- 1. **Explore** questions and topics,
- 2. Investigate questions and experiment with answers,
- 3. Exhibit what they have found or created, and
- 4. **Reflect** on their learning to guide their next projects.

In science, St. Ignatius will use an open inquiry model. In open inquiry, every step of the project, from the development of questions onwards, is student-driven. Teachers provide a grade appropriate level of structure, guidance and support along the way to facilitate student learning. Inquiry arcs will be aligned by trimester, and will include elements of community engagement in the exploration phase, and community service in the exhibition phase. This approach will infuse the Ignatian values of service to God and others through social justice into instruction. Students will not just explore any question that interests them – they will be asked to explain how answering that question will improve the world. Collaboration will be underlined at each stage of inquiry, and various team configurations will give students a chance to work collaboratively in mixed-ability groups.



THE 5 PILLARS OF OUR ACADEMIC DESIGN

The core pillars of St. Ignatius' academic model are five interrelated, innovative approaches that complement one another and combine to create an individualized, rigorous learning environment where every student is supported to grow and succeed across academic subjects.

The five pillars are:

1. Station rotation blended learning in math and English & language arts:

2. Piloting multi-age classrooms with ability grouping, where two grade levels are combined per classroom and students spend two years with each teacher, to be phased-in over time;

3. Inquiry-based learning in trimester-arcs for science/STEAM instruction, and infused across the curriculum;

4. Individualized Learning Plans and student-led conferences including multi-year and trimester academic and non-academic goals and progress metrics across grade levels; and

5. Flexible learning spaces which easily enable cross-class collaboration in addition to students' ability to care for their bodies at the same time as their minds.

Four of these five pillars will be fully implemented in St. Ignatius' first year, while multi-age classrooms will begin as a pilot program. While this is an ambitious approach with many elements that may be new to students and families, the leadership team at St. Ignatius is fully committed to investing the time, effort, and support necessary to clearly communicate and implement each pillar. The approaches mutually support and complement one another, all contributing to a personalized learning environment in which every student across the spectrum of gifts, skills, abilities, and preferences is supported to reach his or her full potential, in the classroom and beyond.
