### PROGRESS REPORT- KAREN MAHONEY


On November 4th, we celebrated the topping of our building! This is a construction milestone. Future Grey Wolves helped Principal Kane to count down to raising the beams in place. What made this event more special is that parishioners and St. Ignatius families signed the topmost beams with their names and the names of loved ones-- another demonstration of how this school and parish are knit together.

The topping was also a sign that construction is on schedule! By mid-December, families should see that "section A" (aka the preK-3rd grade wing) will be "dried in" - meaning that the roof won't leak, the exterior walls are sealed, windows are installed, and exterior doors are in place. Section B (aka the entrance and gym) and section C (4th-8th grade wing) will follow as the crews work from west to east on the project. Having the construction roll in this fashion has allowed trades to work simultaneously and not get in each other's way.

Andi and a small army have been working on making decisions on furniture throughout the whole building - which, when you think about it, is A LOT of furniture! We've decided to have flexible seating in the classrooms - meaning a combination of desks and tables. Research papers and case studies support that this is the most conducive environment to encourage learning. We are working with local furniture suppliers who will bid on the project with hopes to have everything ordered by early January - ensuring that every student has a seat next August!

And while all of this deciding on what to purchase sounds fun (and it is), we are ever mindful that we need to be good stewards of the monies people have contributed to bring this school to fruition. To date, we have received \$4.6M in campaign contributions and the parish has contributed another \$5.5M toward the project. We are so very grateful for every single contribution because each one matters! Construction costs are expected to cost \$10.55M. Additionally, we anticipated approximately \$1M in soft costs to get the school ready for first day of school. These costs include curriculum materials, technology (computers, printers, displays), furniture, etc. If you do the math, we are falling short about \$1.45M. Our fundraising efforts continue - pledges are still trickling in. Because of our potential funding shortfall, we are considering the contingency of a construction loan with the Diocese.

We are encouraged by where things are at in the overall process and we appreciate the ongoing support of Holy Apostles parishioners and St. Ignatius families.



### INNOVATIONS IN LEARNING

As most of you are aware, St. Ignatius Catholic School will be modeled in the Ignatian traditions of education. We are passionate about the infusion of Ignatian Spirituality into the school and throughout our academic curriculum. Ignatian spirituality is such a vivid and yet practical application of our Catholic faith into the world around us. It encourages constant discernment, reflection, growth, and action. These important processes will be specifically taught and infused across subject areas.

Ignatian spirituality teaches us how to be free and find love around us, and to see that God is present in everything. This Ignatian spirituality fits perfectly into the learning environment because it recognizes that each person has his/her own unique gifts, and encourages those gifts to be developed to the fullest. What an amazing school environment that spirituality creates!
