


INNOVATIONS IN LEARNING- MULTI-AGE CLASSROOMS WITH ABILITY GROUPING

In our first year at St. Ignatius, students in several of the grade levels will be assigned to multi-age, mixed-grade classrooms. This will be a pilot program in the school's first year (with only a couple of grades participating), but is anticipated to grow throughout the school over three to five years.

In the multi-age program, students from two grades (e.g., 1st and 2nd grades) are combined in one class. In this multi-age classroom setting, teachers are not teaching two grades in parallel, but they are teaching one group of students, with a variety of skills, talents and ability levels across subjects. Within ability-grouped activities such as station rotation, students will be mixed across ages, according to their skill level. This structure enables students who are behind to get extra support, and students who are ahead of grade level to reach even further ahead and learn from similar ability peers.

Students in the multi-age program will also have the benefit of teacher "looping". Looping is a method in which a teacher will stay with each same-age set of students (from their multi-age class) for a two-year period, giving students and teachers an opportunity to build a much stronger relationship and understanding of one another. The graphic below visualizes the movement of cohorts of students between year 1 and year 2 within the multi-age program.



The leadership team of St. Ignatius has many goals for piloting this approach, including to:

- Enable more differentiated instruction through ability groups, increasing teachers' focus on each individual student's learning progression instead of grade-level labels;
- Foster a "family" style learning environment in which older students set an example for younger students, who naturally look up to and emulate them;
- Reduce instructional time used to lay out procedures and processes, since older students in two-grade classroom will model appropriate behavior for younger students;
- Give teachers two years to understand and teach to the individual needs of their students and build relationships with families; and,
- Encourage collaborative lesson planning and use of space among teachers.

The two-grade, multi-age classrooms at St. Ignatius will be piloted in classrooms where teachers are experienced in multi-grade instruction, and/or with teachers who are eager to pilot this approach. This program will not increase the total number of classrooms or class size, it will only change the composition of student ages and cohorts within each classroom.

THE 5 PILLARS OF OUR ACADEMIC DESIGN

The core pillars of St. Ignatius' academic model are five interrelated, innovative approaches that complement one another and combine to create an individualized, rigorous learning environment where every student is supported to grow and succeed across academic subjects.

The five pillars are:

1. Station rotation blended learning in math and English & language arts:

2. Piloting multi-age classrooms with ability grouping, where two grade levels are combined per classroom and students spend two years with each teacher, to be phased-in over time;

3. Inquiry-based learning in trimester-arcs for science/STEAM instruction, and infused across the curriculum;

4. Individualized Learning Plans and student-led conferences including multi-year and trimester academic and non-academic goals and progress metrics across grade levels; and

5. Flexible learning spaces which easily enable cross-class collaboration in addition to students' ability to care for their bodies at the same time as their minds.

Four of these five pillars will be fully implemented in St. Ignatius' first year, while multi-age classrooms will begin as a pilot program. While this is an ambitious approach with many elements that may be new to students and families, the leadership team at St. Ignatius is fully committed to investing the time, effort, and support necessary to clearly communicate and implement each pillar. The approaches mutually support and complement one another, all contributing to a personalized learning environment in which every student across the spectrum of gifts, skills, abilities, and preferences is supported to reach his or her full potential, in the classroom and beyond.
