## PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Dear St. Ignatius Catholic School Community,

The other day, in a quiet moment when students had gone home for the day, a teacher was standing by our beautiful mosaic, hand extended, touching the tiles higher up on the artwork, with a solemn face as though deep in prayer. Later on the teacher revealed, "I was touching that lamb far off in the distance. The small one there, way up in the hills," and then with a concerned face, "my student needs a little extra love right now."

The care demonstrated by our teachers and staff these first months has been humbling to me. I've watched moments like this unfold many times. A group of teachers talking through solutions to help a student who's struggling academically, a team of classroom aides encouraging students on the playground to seek out someone playing alone, or as in the moment described above, a teacher showing sincere care for a student.

There is no secret from the gospels about Christ's mission on earth. Love. It is made clear by each and every account of the words and actions of Jesus of Nazareth. "Love one another, as I have loved you." It is the most powerful thing.

We continue to grow a strong academic program at St. Ignatius. In specials courses our students are having a chance to experience music, art, dance, PE, makerspace, library, and Spanish. Students are learning daily about the Catholic faith and experience rich opportunities to grow in their own relationship with God. But before all this, our students are experiencing the powerful love of God manifest through the deep care we all commit to them each day. I pray that each and every one of your students has experienced the love of this community and has felt the difference that this kind of support makes not only in the advancement of their education but in every aspect of their life.

# SUPPORT SERVICES SEGMENT- A Message from Mrs. Z:

Positive communication is essential to building and maintaining healthy relationships. This is especially true when it comes to raising and educating children. Our kids are always watching and learning from us as we demonstrate how we choose to communicate with others, positive or otherwise.

In Ignatian spirituality, there's a practice called the presupposition or the 'plus sign'. This idea comes from annotation 22 in St. Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises. A modern version of it from David Fleming, SJ states:

"For a good relationship to develop...a mutual respect is very necessary. ... Every good Christian adopts a more positive acceptance of someone's statement rather than a rejection of it out of hand. And so a favorable interpretation... should always be given to the other's statement, and confusions should be cleared up with Christian understanding."

So in other words, we are called to give others the benefit of the doubt. This is not always easy, as we are constantly bombarded with negative views of others and the world around us, and we all have past experiences (positive and negative) that shape our own views. However, when confronted with a statement or action from someone we encounter, especially our children, St. Ignatius encourages us to make the most favorable interpretation or "plus-sign" and assume that person has good intentions.

When you assume that people have good intentions, misunderstandings are easily reconciled without harming relationships. One of the most important things we can do for our children is to model this kind of positive communication, which fosters healthy relationships and ultimately, hope in our world.
