

REFLECTION: JUNE- REST

"Come to Me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest", Matthew 11:28 NAB. How reassuring and useful is this verse for nowadays? Rest is not something that comes naturally to many people. As a society, we have been accustomed to remain busy. Scripture repeatedly reminds us of the importance of rest and silence. Now that the school year has come to an end and the packed days and evenings are behind us for a while, we can make meaningful rest a priority in our lives. Here are some suggestions to live and share the faith at home.

- 1. This year we celebrate Corpus Christi on Sunday June 3rd. Holy Apostles has a very special procession around the church grounds while ending with a benediction. This is open to anyone and follows immediately after the 11am Mass. It Is a beautiful visual for children of all ages to see. A discussion about the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist can be the topic for dinner as well.
- 2. The Church recognizes the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 8th. Cut a large heart out of paper to represent Jesus' Sacred Heart. Then cut-out smaller ones for each family member, write their name on it. Have each member glue their heart onto Jesus' heart. Finish by offering the family to the Lord's Sacred Heart.
- 3. Father's Day can be celebrated not only for our own Fathers in our lives, but also our parish priests! Take some time to make a card, say a prayer, and/or share how special your parish priest is to your family.
- 4. Set time apart for family rest time. This can be done on Sundays or any other day that works best. During this time, the family can disconnect from electronics and come together to read, play, pray, the possibilities are endless!! Have fun and enjoy one another's company.
