GREAT THINGS HAPPENING!



We opened our doors this year to 452 students and 55 staff who are filling our school with the sounds of laughter, excitement, and learning. In addition to all the new student and staff faces, we have made some other exciting changes this year. Troy Partin will now be acting as our Assistant Principal for Student Growth. As most of you know, last year Mr. Partin was a member of the leadership team and one of our 6th grade homeroom teachers. He also did a great job helping take over many of Mrs. Kane's duties last spring when she was out on medical leave. Mr. Partin will continue to teach part-time in the middle school, but he will spend the majority of his time helping with administrative tasks such as student behavioral growth, scheduling, facilities and technology.

In addition, we are focused this year on making sure that our pre-school program is really integrated with our K-8th grade program. In an effort to help facilitate that contiguity and bridge our pre-school with the rest of our school, Trina King is now acting as our Early Childhood Coordinator. Mrs. King adds this role to her existing duties on our Leadership Team and as one of our amazing kindergarten teachers.

Another exciting change that you may have heard about is our Paw Prints program. As part of our commitment to educating the whole child, this program helps encourage children to manage their emotions, engage in positive social interaction, and behave as disciples of Christ. Students are given a Paw Print whenever they are found following the Path of St. Ignatius by growing or learning, or being loving, reverent, or a seeker of justice. The students and staff have quickly embraced this program and we are excited to watch it flourish.

IDEAL 529 COLLEGE SAVINGS PROGRAM-

As of 2018, you can now use funds to pay for K-12 tuition!

What is a "529 plan"?

Named for Section 529 of the U.S. tax code, a 529 plan is a tax-advantaged investment plan operated by a state to encourage saving for education expenses. As there is risk when investing in a 529 account, we encourage you to talk to a financial advisor.

What are the qualifying education expenses?

Following the passage of 2017's Tax Cut and Jobs Act, funds in a 529 plan may be used for tuition, books, fees, computer technology, or room and board at a qualifying college *and for up to \$10,000 in tuition at a K-12 private or religious school per year per student.*

REFLECTION: SEPTEMBER: PRAYER

"Pray without ceasing" is what St. Paul says in 1 Thessalonians 5:17. Praying is a very powerful weapon we can use in all circumstances. No prayer to big or small is ever wasted! There are many ways and forms to pray. But the main thing to keep in mind about prayer, is how it is a chance to be in deep communication with God! As Catholics, we are extremely blessed with many resources and examples from the Saints on different opportunities we are given to pray. We can use formal prayers and informal prayers. This month spend some time digging deep into prayer!

- 1. Praying as a family is not only rewarding but it increases unity! Sit down as a family and start a prayer routine along with a "praying space" in your home. It doesn't have to take long or even be elaborate. Whatever works for the family! Practical is key! Using favorite Christian books, pictures, a Crucifix, and a Catholic Bible are great starters!
- 2. Mass is the greatest prayer we have as Catholics! Take some time to learn about the Mass and our role as a community in it! Our FORMED program through the parish has a great cartoon to watch as a family. It is called Brother Francis: The Mass, A Life-Giving Prayer. Contact the Parish Office for more info.
- 3. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says there are 5 Forms of Prayer: 1. Adoration 2. Petition 3. Intercession 4. Thanksgiving 5. Praise. Learn and incorporate each one throughout the month as a family (books, videos, google searches, can help with this).
- 4. Do some research on formal prayers the Church has already produced for us! You can find one specifically for families or a cause your family has. Then print a photo of it so it can be used and memorized. Tip: Hang it in a spot where it can be viewed a few times a day

VOLUNTEER AT ST. IGNATIUS

At St. Ignatius Catholic School, the growth of our students is a cooperative and collaborative effort by and among families, the school community, and the church. In this vein, we ask the parents of our community to share their gifts and talents. We hope that we can make this experience rewarding for both your family and our community!

We are always looking for school day volunteers (sign up <u>HERE</u>) or volunteers for our many fun events! Please remember you must be Safe Environment trained (and updated) in order to work in the school during school hours.

We received feedback last year that some found recording volunteer hours in signup.com to be a cumbersome process. We will still be using signup.com to sign up for volunteering but we have simplified the process of recording your volunteer hours. You will now find a volunteer binder located at the front office. Now you will simply stop by the front office at your convenience (not necessarily at the time you are doing your hours), find your family's page in the binder, and record any and all school volunteer hours your family (or anyone working on behalf of your family) has completed. We hope this greatly simplifies the process for everyone.

Remember, we require that each family contribute at least 25 hours of assistance per year to school sponsored events and activities, including involvement in at least one fund raising event. Families that fail to complete and record 25 hours of participation will be charged \$25 per hour that is not completed. We welcome parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, or friends to assist you in completing your family's required hours.
