



FAMILIES ON FIRE



At Holy Apostles Catholic Church and St. Ignatius Catholic School, we are constantly reminding our students and children that God is all around us- in everything we do and in all we celebrate. We remind our students and youth to look for God in all things, and find ways to see and encounter God in both special and common ways. We would like to start partnering with families to offer ideas that might help you infuse faith into more aspects of your daily lives, routines, and celebrations.

REFLECTION: DEC/JAN: REVERENCE

As we come together to celebrate the birth of our King, we can take some time to fine tune our reverence towards God and all He has revealed. The short Liturgical Season of Christmas (12 days!) is a great opportunity to work on ways to fear the Lord! Fear of the Lord means to be in complete awe and wonder with Him and all He does. Living life with eyes of reverence leads to humility because then we are able to realize how much God loves us! As a family, come up with and infuse reverence for God and His creation in everyday situations.

- 1. 12/25- Christmas Day!! Start off the first day of Christmas with an extremely reverent heart! After opening gifts and still in the excitement, write out a short prayer of awe to the Blessed Trinity to remind us that God can be found in ALL things and everywhere! Use this as a daily family prayer for the remaining days of Christmas. Each day a new line can be added about what God revealed that day!
- 2. 12/30- Feast of the Holy Family. We know that the Holy Family (Jesus, Mary, and Joseph) lived as a normal family during Jesus' time on earth, they shared many of the same struggles we face today. Make this a grand day of feasting as a family!! Hang out as a family-cook dinner together, play a game, watch a movie, and pray together asking the Holy Family for guidance. Talk about how each family member can practice more reverence toward one another. Then start by doing random acts of kindness.
- 3. 1/13- Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The Sacrament of Baptism is definitely something we can be in awe about! Find the baptismal promises online and as a family renew them together after dinner. A candle can be lit to signify the Light we receive from Christ as members of the Church. Find a short video on FORMED to learn more about Baptism!
- 4. 1/31- Feast of St. John Bosco. Watch this quick video describing a little of this saint's life and how he used to entertain the young children he worked with! https://youtu.be/5rXZxoLCkes Try to take turns juggling and see how far each member gets! There are some great tutorials online about juggling!

2019 Registration

It is hard to believe but 2019 is here! And the 2019/2020 academic year is coming quickly.

We will begin the process of re-registering our existing students in January/February. Once our existing students have re-registered, we will fill any open spots in our enrollment with students from our waiting list. Siblings of existing students will receive top priority in our enrollment but they must be on our waiting list by January 28th.

If you or someone that you know is interested in learning more about enrolling in St. Ignatius Catholic School, please encourage them to come in for a tour. We meet with prospective families every Wednesday at 10:30am. We tour the school, discuss our academic model, and answer questions about our program. Students are invited and encouraged to attend.

Again, we will begin enrolling students from our waiting list as early as January 28th. So please make sure that if you have a new student that you wish to enroll for next year, you complete a pre-registration form (waiting list form) and submit it to the front office as soon as possible.
