MAGIS~ the A is for Academics

This year our school theme is "Magis". If you ask a St. Ignatius student, he or she will likely be able to tell you that *Magis* is the Latin word that means "the more" or "greater". St. Ignatius used the concept of the *Magis* to inspire the first Jesuits to be constantly seeking ways that they could be their best in order to serve God and draw ever closer to him.

At St. Ignatius, we use the word *Magis* to remind us to be seeking our highest potential intellectually, spiritually and physically.

This month's *Magis* focus is *A for Academics*. Students and teachers are looking for ways we can reach our highest potential intellectually. Here are some of the ways we are encouraging students to reach their *Magis* in academics...

- Do your best work *every* time
- Redo work that isn't high quality
- Ask questions when you don't understand
- Look for ways to go deeper into learning
- Find things you are curious about and ask for or look up information
- Choose project topics and themes that inspire your passions
- Participate in class and in collaborative time
- Be willing to take risks, to fail, and to grow
- Avoid distractions at home and school that prevent learning and growing

The opposite of *Magis* is mediocre. At our most recent school assembly I asked students to define mediocre. They gave the answers, "laziness," "not reaching your potential," and "Just OK".

It's not OK to be just OK! At St. Ignatius we believe that our opportunity to learn is a gift from God meant to bring us closer to him, and allow us to better serve our world. Ask a St. Ignatius student this month how he or she will be avoiding mediocrity and reaching for his or her personal *Magis* in academics!




GREAT THINGS HAPPENING!

- Students showing reverence at All School Mass and during assemblies Great job to our students and staff! What a great week we had celebrating our Catholic schools!







We remind our students and youth to look for God in all things, and find ways to see and encounter God in both special and common ways. We would like to start partnering with families to offer ideas that might help you infuse faith into more aspects of your daily lives, routines, and celebrations.

REFLECTION: WISDOM

According to the Catholic Dictionary, Wisdom is the first and highest gifts of the Holy Spirit. It makes the soul open and responsive to God in the contemplation of Divine things. The saints advanced in their spiritual life because of the wisdom they were given by God and they knew this. We have to acknowledge that true wisdom can only be found in God and His truth. By the grace of God's holy wisdom, then we are able to see things the way God sees them. We can use this month to pray for wisdom in ourselves and in our families. Come Holy Spirit, giver of wisdom!!

- 1. Sundays: Come together as a family on the day of the Lord to study the Word of God. The Bible has a whole book dedicated to Wisdom! The Book of Wisdom is in the Old Testament but has some great information to be used in our times. There are some study guides online that help break down the meaning. Find a verse or two to memorize and quiz each other on!
- 2. 2/2~ Feast of the Presentation of the Lord: Since this feast falls on a Saturday, it is a perfect opportunity to have a meal around the table and discuss ways to dedicate ourselves to God and His Kingdom. Start dinner with a prayer to Jesus to bring to light ways to serve Him.
- 3. 2/11- Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes: The Mother of Jesus is still helping us today! Learn more about this Marian apparition and how it can give us strength on our Catholic journey. A novena (nine-day short prayer) of Our Lady of Lourdes can be found here https://www.ewtn.com/devotionals/novena/lourdes.htm. The prayer can be used anytime throughout the month. Coloring sheets can be used too!
- 4. 2/22- Feast of the Chair of St. Peter: How amazing is it to know that our first Pope was St. Peter!! Pray for Pope Francis! Learn more about who Pope Francis is and his journey of faith. FORMED has a short video about him and his life. Coloring sheets are great for this too!


