PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Have we changed this Lent? This is the challenge I have given our students these past five weeks. Pay attention. Listen. Ask God to work and move and grow in you. How will you be different this Easter than you were at the start of the Lenten season?

Each Monday in Lent our school gathers in the Commons to sing together and to hear the Gospel message. Then, on Friday afternoon we gather back together again to pray the Examen. At this time students are asked to look backward through their day and week, noticing the places that God was speaking to them, and being aware of the ways in which they have changed.

This past Friday, after the Examen, I asked students if they had noticed a change. My question was met with head nods and muttering tones of affirmation coming together to signify "of course we have!" from our student body. Of course, our students have changed this Lent. They have grown taller and learned new material. They have struggled through a social interaction and made headway on a sport or skill. But more, I truly believe our students have become more loving, more reverent, more determined, and more faithful.

Our students are examples to all of us of the change God hopes to see in us this Lent and always.

On Thursday, April 12th, our students will present their Faith in Action projects to our parish and school community. These projects include a range of services our students have completed including clothing drives, volunteering at shelters, drawing awareness to human injustices, creating programs to help other students or members of our community, and so much more.

Our students have completed over 200 individual service projects and ten class projects. The impact of this work on our local community is astounding!

Students have spent time reflecting on the service they completed and how it impacted their community. What our students have learned is that the impact of their service is not only outward, but inward. Our students have truly changed this Lent. We are never too young, or too old, to let God move and grow in us. I'm grateful to be surrounded by our students who serve as perfect examples of this every day.

FAMILIES ON FIRE



At Holy Apostles Catholic Church and St. Ignatius Catholic School, we are constantly reminding our students and children that God is all around us- in everything we do and in all we celebrate. We remind our students and youth to look for God in all things, and find ways to see and encounter God in both special and common ways. We would like to partner with families to offer ideas that might help you infuse faith into more aspects of your daily lives, routines, and celebrations.

REFLECTION: VIRTUE

During this month we will be closing the Lenten season and opening the Easter season. What better way to finish one season strong and start another season stronger than allowing time to reflect on our spiritual journey so far?! Every so often, it is beneficial to step back from our busy lives and do a well-check. How are our steps toward our call to holiness going? A great way to deepen our growth is to focus on virtue. Virtue derives from the Latin root meaning, for man. As time went on, the Church has established theological and moral virtues essential to a Christian's life. These virtues are needed to gain strength, awareness, and an authentic relationship with God as our Father and Creator. Let us invite the Holy Spirit to help us in these graces.

- 1. Fridays: Fridays during Lent are a great opportunity to enter the season deeper. Participating in an extra activity such as Stations of the Cross, fasting and offering it up together, praying the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary are powerful meditations which can increase our understanding of Jesus' love for us. Holy Apostles as well as other parishes have some community events throughout the month. Attend one as a family.
- 2. Holy Week: Take a few minutes to reflect and discuss the life-changing events which took place during this week, years ago, while using books and Sacred Scripture. Starting with Palm Sunday and leading up to Easter Sunday! Holy Heroes Adventures has a detailed book to help families live out the week. - 3. Easter Sunday: Start a meaningful Easter family tradition! Paint/color/create an Alleluia picture together, make and decorate a Paschal candle and have it blessed, plant a resurrection garden in a pot. All of these can be used in the family prayer space during the Easter season.
- 4. Divine Mercy Sunday: Mercy is something that goes beyond forgiveness. Watch a video about how our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in the 1930s explaining the transforming Divine Mercy that can only be found in Him! Add a Divine Mercy picture or statue to the family prayer space to help reflect on this beautiful gift. Pray a Divine Mercy Chaplet as a family to ask for grace to grow in mercy.
